

Rolesville High School NHS Discipline and Dismissal Policy

Members of the Rolesville High School NHS should understand that they are subject to discipline and/or dismissal if they do not maintain the standards of scholarship, leadership, service, and character that were used as the basis of their selection. The Faculty Council of the Rolesville High School NHS has the following procedures for the administration of discipline and possible dismissal to members.

Scholarship

Members who fail to maintain the minimum required cumulative GPA (3.60, weighted) will be issued a formal notice and placed on probation. This notice will indicate the deficiency in the member's academic record and give the member one academic semester to re-establish a cumulative GPA which qualifies for membership.

If the member does re-establish a qualifying cumulative GPA by the stated deadline, full membership will be restored. If a qualifying cumulative GPA is not established by the stated deadline, the member will face dismissal from NHS.

If a member is found to have a weighted GPA below the 3.60 cutoff after the first semester of their senior year, they will face dismissal from NHS due to the fact that GPA is not calculated again before graduation.

Service & Leadership

If the member does not complete their service hours and turn in the form by the deadline, they will be issued a formal notice, will be placed on probation, and be required to make up the hours during the next semester. If the hours are not made up, the member will face dismissal from NHS.

Character

Members who fail to demonstrate character that is consistent with the NHS charter will be issued a formal notice. This includes a member's character both inside and outside of schools. Any consequence of probation/dismissal will be dealt with on a case by case basis.

Academic dishonesty in any form is a serious offense in any institution of learning. Any discipline reports of plagiarism or cheating will result in **IMMEDIATELY FACING DISMISSAL** from NHS.

If a member fails to perform any of the published obligations of membership, they will be placed on probation. If the obligation remains unmet at the end of the probation period, the member will face dismissal from NHS.

Appeals

Any member who is dismissed may appeal to the Principal for reconsideration. Such appeal must be made in writing within two weeks from the date of dismissal.

Dismissal

In the event that a student has been dismissed from their membership, any privileges that go with the membership are also lost. The student cannot wear the NHS emblem or the NHS stole at graduation. This means that the student cannot use NHS as an activity or honor on any college or scholarship applications. Advisers will contact all colleges/universities that the student applied to, was accepted, or has matriculated into. It will not matter when, during the year, that the student's membership was revoked -- colleges will be contacted as a result.

****The probation period is the member's designated period of time to remedy their standing with the Rolesville High School NHS chapter. All instances of probation will be signed off on by the chapter advisor and school principal. A member's placing on probation is an NHS matter and will not be recorded on their high school transcripts.**

****A member will only be permitted one probation period during their membership in NHS.**

****Any other infraction not explicitly listed in this document may still cause a member to be placed on probation or face dismissal from NHS.**

****A member who is dismissed or who resigns from NHS is never again eligible for membership.**
